CPAC Mentoring for Professional Engineering Licensure is a program designed to help internationally trained engineers obtain license. Participants of the program will receive in-depth information on the application process, profession-specific language training as well as individualized support from mentors with P. Eng. This program is funded by the Government of Ontario.

Partners of the program include Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO), Skills for Change (SfC), the Centre for Information and Community Services (CICS), and CPAC Career Service Centre.

## FOR WHOM

To be eligible for this program, you need to be a permanent resident or citizen of Canada, have an engineering degree obtained from outside of Canada, language skills of CLB Level 7 or higher, and engineering experience in Canada.

## THE PROGRAM

The program consists of the following components: **information sessions, language training, mentoring** and **job search support** delivered by a group of partner organizations. Each component addresses one aspect of the licensing process and all the components work in support to each other, offering a comprehensive package to the participants.

A program cycle begins with the information session and the in-take process, followed by the language training and mentoring plus the job search support to those who need the service.

### INFORMATION SESSION

Representatives from PEO will speak about the licensing process, and in particular the recent changes for internationally trained engineers. Topics include credential assessment, the experience requirement, the EIT program and issues of concern to internationally trained engineers.

### LANGUAGE TRAINING

The profession-specific language training consists of 18 hours classroom instruction. It will prepare the participants with the language and communication skills required for professional engineer licensing. Topics include: engineering terminology, language used in PPE exam, report writing, and workplace culture and communication. Classes are in the evenings and on weekends.

Participants need to go through both pre and post training assessments.

### JOB SEARCH ENPOWERMENT WORKSHOP

This workshop will enhance participants' job search skills. Topics include resume writing and interview techniques. You will learn how to present your skills and experience to employers, customize your resume to the requirement of the employer and strategies for dealing with interview questions.

### MENTORING

Participants will be matched with mentors based on needs and professional background. Mentors will provide advice, guidance and hands-on assistance to the mentees (participants) on every aspect of the application process through one-on-one or group mentoring. Technical support from PEO is available for both the mentors and mentees.
